The Narara Creek Virtual Catchment Crawl (Workshop).

This workshop is designed to show, teachers, environmental educators and community support officers, how to bring local residents, agencies, schools and interested persons together to raise awareness of catchment issues. It is a virtual excursion of an actual creek on the Central Coast. Participants will conduct water quality tests, site assessments and aquatic macroinvertebrate surveys at three virtual stops along the catchment.
